### Mr. Williams Tech Corner

Online education can be scary at first. It seems as if many things are coming to us all at once. For students on the Spectrum and their parents/guardians these changes can be daunting. Just like in regular classroom settings, our students and parents need to regulate behaviors and schedules. One user friendly way is the "First-Then" visual communication. "First-Then" is an evidenced best practice for students on the Autism Spectrum.

Fortunately, technology can help with providing a simple a way to create a "First-Then" schedule with the use of two highly rated smartphone app!

"First Then" created by ausoft.ru is available for Android and is a free app that allows you to upload pictures already on your phone or ones you download to the "first-then" schedule. You can also set timer and more!

"First Then Visual Schedule" is available for users with iOS (Apple) devices and costs \$9.99. This app comes loaded with features and customizations.
